



## Social and community-building activities

- Hold annual “visioning” exercises to get members’ input on the ROC’s future.
- Conduct periodic surveys to find out how satisfied members are with the community, what they want to see improved, and what they feel is going right.
- At annual meeting, provide members with the opportunity to participate in making a mural that represents the ROC.
- Collectively develop a ROC symbol or logo.
- Host a community cleanup project.
- Form a team to participate in a local community fundraiser, such as a walk-a-thon.
- Start a neighborhood watch.
- Build a community garden, common area or playground.
- Start a garden club that exchanges advice and cuttings.
- Hold a block party.
- Hold a progressive dinner that gives people the opportunity to get together to share the cost, planning and preparation of meals.
- Hold a cards night.
- Host a holiday cookie swap.
- Hold a movie and popcorn night in the community building or other space.
- Start a study circle on a topic that interests members.
- Form an advocacy group to follow pending legislation that affects manufactured housing.
- Host a presidential/congressional/district/town candidates gathering.
- Form a ROC team to adopt a highway or a section of the town you live in.

- Hold a ROC art show for kids.
- Start a community assistance team to help those in the community who need it.
- Organize a work party to build a shed for ROC tools, lawnmowers, etc.
- Start a disaster-planning group.
- Hold a hobby night.
- Hold a potluck dinner.
